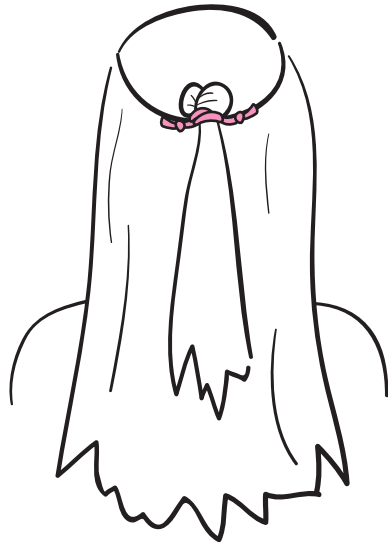


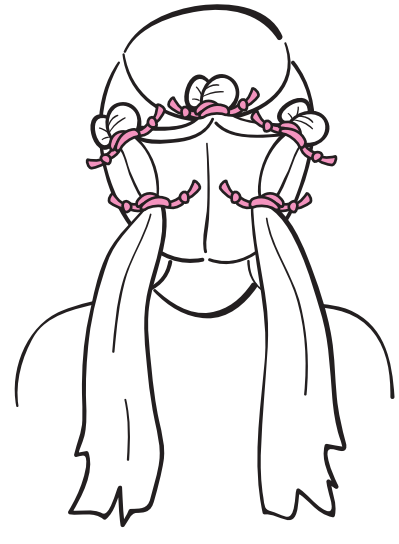
Heather Bailey's TRASH TIES™



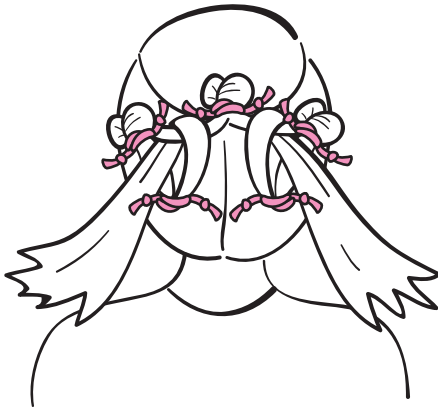
1. Pull back hair at top of head. Knot hair. Secure below knot with Trash Tie.



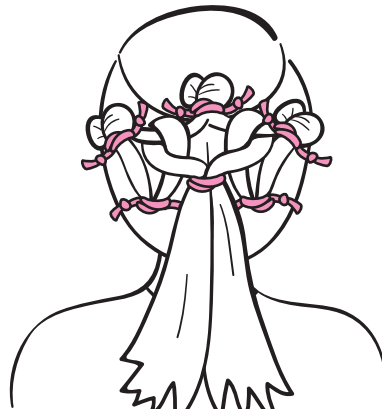
2. Gather each half of tail with hair at same side of head. Knot hair. Secure below knot with Trash Tie.



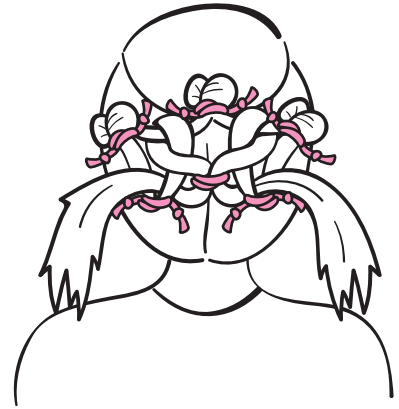
3. Part loose hair down the middle. Secure two pig tails with Trash Ties.



4. Twist each pig tail to smooth strands. Pull each pig tail upward and loop over horizontal rope of hair (formed in Step 2).



5. Gather both tails together. Secure with one Trash Tie.



6. Feed each half of tail through vertical rope of hair (formed in Step 4).



7. Secure one Trash Tie around each protruding pig tail to prevent pig tail from slipping out of position.
